From the Counseling Center

Registration for 2020-2021 on January 16 Just a reminder that counselors will be out of our offices visiting local middle schools during the next couple of weeks. LWHS students will register on line on January 16. In case your LWHS student missed information or registration, make-up will be January 22 in the Career Center. Our course catalog is available on the <u>LWHS website</u>. We urge students to become familiar with the courses that they plan to register for—i.e. read the course content, amount of homework expected, etc. If your student is considering signing up for an honors or AP course, students should meet with their current subject teacher to make sure that the course is a good fit for them.

Semester 2 Schedules

Students will be able to view their second semester schedule on January 24. If they would like to change a semester elective, they need to download the "Schedule Change Request Form" (available on the LWHS website at 3:30 pm on January 24), complete it, and turn it in to the Counseling Center anytime between **January 27 and end of day on January 31**. If the counselor can make the change, students will be able to view their new schedule online. As always, schedule change requests based on teacher choice, teacher style, or lunch assignments will <u>not</u> be considered.

The End is Near: Finals are Coming!

Dread. Anxiety. Fear. Many students experience one or a combination of these emotions when they think about semester finals. With careful planning, though, these emotions can be lessened. Preparation is the key. Students should know what is going to be tested and how the test will be formatted. For instance, will the semester exam cover the entire semester? Will the exam be essay questions or multiple guess? If there is anything that a student doesn't understand, meeting with the teacher early is critical. This translates into reviewing for the final early and consistently. Research has shown that cramming the night before simply doesn't work. Besides, who is there at 2 am to answer questions? Students should review homework assignments, the textbook, and the teacher's lecture notes. Sometimes forming a study group is helpful. Of course, it goes without saying that students think more clearly when they eat a good breakfast and have a good night's sleep. And, finally, it's important to remember that while that semester final is important, it is the process of learning that is most important.
