#### AP Exam Summary Sheets

Students received an AP Exam Summary sheet that lists the AP Exams that they have paid/registered for. This summary is just for their information. Please review it carefully with your student. If they feel like they would like to register for additional AP Exams, they

can take advantage of the late registration dates to enroll in additional exams. Again, this summary sheet is just for their information. They don't have to do anything with it.

#### Late Registration for Advanced Placement Exams

LWSD is offering a late AP Exam registration window from February 18, 2020 through the end of the school day on February 27, 2020. Students who register during the late AP Exam registration window will incur a \$50 per exam late fee in addition to the \$96 per exam fee. Students will pay with check or cash; checks are made payable to Lake Washington School District. No online payments will be accepted. The cash or check is placed in the registration envelope that is available in the Counseling department. Students need their school ID card with them when they pay for their exams at the bookkeeper's window. Students are encouraged not to wait until the final day to pay for their exam(s). Absolutely no AP Exam registrations will be accepted after the end of the school day on February 27, 2020.
