I did want to take this opportunity to THANK the dedicated and hard working teachers, staff, parents and students we had the opportunity to collaborate with over the year. An extra heartfelt thanks to the many volunteers who support our students and staff. And for those of you that make a financial contribution, we couldn't run many of our programs without you!

Because of all of you, we were able to provide over \$12,000 in classroom and ASB grants to our teachers, staff and student groups and also support families in need during this unprecedented time. Before school was cancelled, we held College App workshops, Fear Free ACT/SAT testing, and supported EPrep supplies, Student Recognition programs, Staff Appreciation events, Student Supplies and so much more! Many of our senior and end-of-year events had to be cancelled, but we pivoted to support school events and provide a special Senior Salute memory booklet, distributed 250 Class of 2020 yard signs including 40 for families in need, and still hope to be able to provide some programming over the summer if allowed by public health guidelines.

All of this could not have happened without the work of our many chairs and PTSA volunteers, for this, we are eternally grateful! We look forward to continuing this work next year in whatever form that may take. District Seeking Feedback - Complete the ThoughtExchange Surveys

As a school district and as a community, we're faced with significant challenges in figuring out how best to deliver a world class education to our students in the face of a pandemic and also how to address structural inequities that are present in our educational system and our society. The district needs your help to inform this work. The district is gathering information through ThoughtExchanges. A ThoughtExchange is a unique community engagement experience where you get to share your thoughts and then rate the thoughts of other people that are participating. It is open-ended which means the district gets to hear your voice, directly from your perspective. The ratings also help them understand how broadly a thought might be shared with other people.

There are three ThoughtExchanges being conducted:

- <u>The first exchange</u> asks you to reflect on the challenges that remote learning and working presented you with this spring.
- <u>The second exchange</u> asks you about what worked this spring.

• The third exchange (coming soon) will ask you about your hopes and priorities for the next school year.

Final Transcripts

If they haven't already, seniors need to let the counseling office <u>know where they're</u> <u>headed after graduation</u> and where they need their final transcript to be sent. The <u>How to</u> <u>Send Final Transcript</u> video can provide additional information and instructions.

- Additional official transcripts can be requested after June 30.
- Final transcripts will be sent to colleges by July 1.
- If your student is registered with NCAA Eligibility Center, the transcript will be uploaded on your student's behalf once final grades have been posted.

Kirkland Safer Routes to School - Your Input is Needed

The Kirkland City Council directed staff to work with Kirkland neighborhoods, parents and PTSAs to develop a prioritized list of walk and bike improvements to make it easier and safer for children to walk and bike to the bus and school.

The walk recommendations resulted from a year-long public engagement process and engineering analysis of Kirkland's transportation network. More than 550 suggested projects were reviewed and analyzed by both City engineering staff and an independent engineering consultant.



The City is now ready to gather input on the preliminary list of walk recommendations. This is your change to document which ones you think are most important for your school/neighborhood. Anyone can vote, even if you don't have school age children. There are three ways to provide input.

- 1. **Neighborhood Zoom Meeting:** The walk recommendations and instructions for online voting will be presented during neighborhood zoom meetings. You will have the opportunity to ask questions, get clarification on specific projects, and learn how to vote. <u>Click here</u> to see when your neighborhood zoom meeting is scheduled.
- 1. **Online:** You can access <u>information</u> regarding Safer Routes to School Action Plans online. After June 1, you can <u>vote for your top three walk recommendations</u> online.
- 1. **Email or phone:** Voting can be done by contacting Kari Page at <u>KPage@kirklandwa.gov</u> or (425) 587-3875.

You are encouraged to walk (or drive) by the projects with your school age children and vote together. Note you will be asked to pick your top three projects. Each household can only vote once. Additional information about the <u>City's technical prioritization criteria</u> is also listed online.

The bike recommendations are being developed as part of the Active Transportation Plan update process underway later this summer and are not included in the walk recommendations in June.
