We have 15 volunteers - some just for the check-in process. We would like to have 12 - 15 chaperones for the actual event. Two seniors have requested scholarships so far which are funded by generous donations from our parent community. We may have extra funds to add entertainment or other party "perks" but also need to make sure we do not encourage larger groups to congregate. We had decided to eliminate the hypnotist (a popular attraction at previous parties) for this reason. We welcome ideas! As far as next year, we need to recruit a chairperson. It would be good to identify a candidate now so they can shadow Debi for the remainder of the year.

Therefore, we will actively support anti-racist policies, programs, and practices to build strong and inclusive communities.
