

WHAT IS SENIOR PARTY?

The Senior Party is presented by the LW PTSA and is a safe and fun-filled all-night party on June 16, the evening of graduation.

WHAT IS INCLUDED IN THE PRICE OF THE TICKET?

The ticket price includes transportation to both venues, food at each venue, and various types of fun entertainment for seniors to enjoy!

HOW MUCH IS A TICKET?

Ticket prices vary by when you buy them. The price increases as it gets closer to the party.

\$190 through Feb 18th

\$200 through April 27th

\$210 through June 2nd

SALES END ON JUNE 2nd!

HOW DO I PURCHASE A TICKET FOR MY SENIOR?

Tickets can be purchased online through the PTSA website-Seniors-Senior Party Tickets. You do not need to be a member of PTSA to buy a ticket, but you do need to set up an account.

WHAT ARE THE OPTIONS TO PAY FOR A TICKET?

When you pay online, you can choose to pay via PayPal or by check. Please drop any checks off at the LWHS office.

WHAT IF A SENIOR NEEDS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO ATTEND?

Scholarships or an installment plan are offered! See Jodee Hull in the main office or email her at jhull@lwsd.org.

WHAT IS THE LAST DAY TO PURCHASE A TICKET?

June 2st will be the last day to purchase a ticket.

WHAT IS THE REFUND POLICY?

There are no refunds.

WHERE WILL THE SENIOR PARTY BE HELD?

The location of the celebration will be a surprise until the buses arrive at the venues.

WHAT TIME IS CHECK IN?

Bus Check In will begin at 9 :15 PM at LWHS.

WHAT HAPPENS AT CHECK IN?

Seniors check in by bus color, which they will sign up for in advance. Personal items should be left at home. Any personal items (phone, Apple watches, wallets, etc.) will be put in a quart size plastic bag at check in. Students are searched before loading the buses. Release forms are signed again at check in, and any medications or special food are processed by adult volunteers.

WHAT SHOULD BE LEFT AT HOME?

- Purses, bags or backpacks
- Cell phones or other electronics
- Money
- Food or beverages (unless you have a life-threatening condition and have made

arrangements with the Senior Party Chairs).

If you bring something that is not allowed to be kept on your person, a zip lock bag will be provided and your items will stay with the Senior Party Committee. The Committee accepts no responsibility for any loss or theft of possessions and are kept for the duration of the party.

WHAT TO BRING TO CHECK IN?

- ☒ Wear comfortable, casual attire (think gym clothes) and bring a layers (t-shirt/sweatshirt)
- ☒ Any emergency medical needs (e.g. epi-pen, insulin, inhaler, etc). You will be allowed to keep it on your person if so indicated on your Emergency Care Plan. If you have life-threatening allergies, we require a completed and signed Allergy Emergency Care Plan and it should already have been submitted to Senior Party Chairs before check in.

WHAT IF SOMEONE IS FOUND TO HAVE DRUGS, ALCOHOL, WEAPONS, OR A TOBACCO/VAPE PRODUCT ON THEM?

Senior Party is a safe event. There will be zero tolerance for tobacco, alcohol, drugs or weapons of any kind. People under the influence will not be able to participate. If found at check in, they will not be able to board the bus. If found at the venue, parents will be contacted. No refund will be provided.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU ARE LATE TO CHECK IN?

Anyone not checked in, searched and on the bus by 10:00pm will be left behind. NO REFUNDS will be given for missing the event.

WHAT TIME IS PICK UP AND WHERE?

Buses will return to the High School around 5:30 AM on June 17th. Seniors will be very tired after staying up all-night and it is recommended that an adult comes to pick them up. We ask that their ride home arrive early and be there waiting for the buses by 5:15 am on June 17th.

WHAT IF MY SENIOR NEEDS PERSONAL MEDICATIONS?

If your senior takes medications that are needed during the event, you will need to indicate this on the Emergency Care Plan and check the medication in with the Senior Party Committee representative at the time of check in. Medications must be in a prescription container marked with Senior's name. The medication will be placed in a zip lock bag, marked with Senior's name, along with a signed note by the parent with specific dispensing instructions. Non-emergency medications will be kept with an adult chaperone during the event.

WHAT IF MY SENIOR HAS A FOOD ALLERGY?

If any senior suffers from food or beverage allergies, it is the sole responsibility of the attendee and their parent or guardian to determine if the attendee can safely attend the event, to determine what food and beverages to consume or avoid at the event and to bring their own food to the event as necessary. **The facilities or vendors supplying food and beverages for the event WILL NOT take any precautions in the preparation and service of food and beverages to protect against any food and beverage allergies. Peanuts and other allergen producing ingredients may be used and utensils may have come into contact with allergen producing ingredients.** Seniors with serious allergies should act accordingly and can bring their own food to the event. Food can be given to the appointed adult chaperone at check in.

WHAT RELEASES ARE NEEDED TO ASSURE MY SENIOR CAN ATTEND?

All Seniors must have a Senior Party Release Form turned in before signing up for a bus. The form

should be signed by the senior AND parent, regardless of if the senior is 18 already. The form will be resigned at check in.

Any senior with a food or beverage allergy or any medical condition needs to complete the Emergency Care Plan form and submit it before signing up for a bus.
