



SENIOR PARTY FAQ: EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT SENIOR PARTY 2022

WHAT IS SENIOR PARTY?

The Senior Party is organized by LWHS PTSA. It is a fun, safe, and substance-free all-night celebration that occurs the evening of graduation, June 14th and goes until the early morning of June 15th.

WHAT IS INCLUDED IN THE PRICE OF THE TICKET?

The ticket price includes transportation to two venues, food at each venue, various types of entertainment for Seniors to enjoy!

HOW MUCH IS A TICKET?

The ticket price increases as the date for the party gets closer. Tickets from December 14, 2021, to January 31, 2022, are \$190. Tickets from February 1st to April 15, 2022, are \$200. Tickets from April 16, 2022, to June 1, 2022, are \$210.

HOW DO I PURCHASE A TICKET FOR MY SENIOR?

Tickets can be purchased online through the [LWHS PTSA website](#) – see the Senior Party Info 2022 page under the Seniors tab for a link. There will also be tickets sold during lunches on certain days; dates will be listed in the Kang Crier and school announcements.

WHAT ARE THE OPTIONS TO PAY FOR A TICKET?

When you purchase a ticket online, you can choose to pay via PayPal or by check. If you buy a ticket at school, please pay by check.

WHAT IF A SENIOR NEEDS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO ATTEND?

WHAT IS THE LAST DAY TO PURCHASE A TICKET?

June 1st will be the last day to purchase a ticket either online or in person.

WHAT IS THE REFUND POLICY?

There are no refunds.

WHERE WILL THE SENIOR PARTY BE HELD?

The location of the celebration will be a surprise until the buses arrive at the venues.

WHAT TIME IS CHECK IN?

The location and time of check-in will be communicated once the graduation time is announced. This year, if there is a late graduation time, check-in will occur at the UW arena immediately following the graduation ceremony. In general, check-in usually begins at 9:30 PM with buses loading at 10 PM.

WHAT HAPPENS AT CHECK-IN?

Seniors check in by bus color. Personal items should be left with parents or at home. Any personal items (phone, Apple watches) will be checked in with an adult volunteer. Students are searched by a same-sex adult before loading the buses. Release forms are signed again at check in, and any medications or food are processed by adult volunteers.

WHAT SHOULD NOT BE BROUGHT TO THE PARTY?

- Absolutely no purses, bags, or backpacks
- No cell phones or other electronics
- No money
- No food or beverages (unless you have a life-threatening condition and have made arrangements with the Senior Party Chairs)

If a Senior brings something that is not allowed to be kept on their person, it will be placed in a zip lock bag and will stay with the Senior Party Committee. The Committee accepts no responsibility for any loss or theft of possessions, which are kept for the duration of the party.

WHAT TO BRING TO CHECK-IN?

- Wear comfortable, casual attire (think gym clothes) and bring layers (t-shirt/sweatshirt)
- Please wear closed-toe shoes (they are required for some events). Socks are strongly recommended.
- Emergency medical items (e.g. epi-pen, insulin, inhaler, etc.) listed on your Emergency Care Plan will be permitted to be kept on your person. If you have life-threatening allergies, we require a completed and signed Allergy Emergency Care Plan, which must be submitted to the Senior Party Chairs prior to graduation.

We will provide more specifics if check-in occurs at the UW arena.

WHAT IF SOMEONE IS FOUND TO HAVE DRUGS, ALCOHOL, WEAPONS, OR A TOBACCO/VAPE PRODUCT ON THEM?

Senior Party is a safe event. There will be zero tolerance for tobacco, alcohol, drugs, or weapons of any kind. If prohibited items are found on a Senior at check in, the Senior will not be permitted to board the bus. Seniors under the influence will not be permitted to participate. If prohibited items are found on a Senior at the venue, the Senior's parents will be contacted for pickup.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU ARE LATE TO CHECK IN?

Anyone not checked in, searched, and on the bus by 10:30 pm will be left behind. NO REFUNDS will be given for missing the event.

WHAT TIME IS PICK UP AND WHERE?

Buses will return to the LWHS around 5:30 am on June 15th. Seniors will be tired and ready to go home! Because Seniors have stayed up all night, it is strongly recommended that they not drive themselves home. We request that Seniors' rides be waiting for the buses by 5:15 am on June 15th.

WHAT IF MY SENIOR NEEDS PERSONAL MEDICATIONS?

If your Senior takes medications that are needed during the event, you will need to indicate this on the Emergency Care Plan and check the medication in with the Graduation Party Committee representative at the time of check-in. Medications must be in a prescription container marked with the Senior's name. The medication will be placed in a zip lock bag, marked with Senior's name, along with a signed note by the parent with specific dispensing instructions. Non-emergency medications will be kept with an adult chaperone during the event.

WHAT IF MY SENIOR HAS A FOOD ALLERGY?

If a Senior suffers from food or beverage allergies, it is the sole responsibility of the Senior and their parent or guardian to determine if the Senior can safely attend the event, to determine what food and beverages to consume or avoid at the event, and to bring their own food to the event if necessary. **The facilities or vendors supplying food and beverages for the event WILL NOT take any precautions in the preparation and service of food and beverages to protect against any food and beverage allergies. Peanuts and other allergen-producing ingredients may be used and utensils may have come into contact with allergen-producing ingredients.** Seniors with serious allergies should act accordingly and can bring their own food to the event. Food can be given to the appointed adult chaperone at check-in.

WHAT FORMS ARE NEEDED TO ENSURE MY SENIOR CAN ATTEND?

All Seniors must have a Senior Party Release Form turned in before signing up for a bus. The form should be signed by the Senior AND parent, regardless whether the Senior is 18 already. The form will be turned in at check-in.

All seniors must have a COVID waiver signed by a parent and the Senior, regardless of whether the Senior is 18.

Any Senior with a food or beverage allergy or any medical condition needs to complete the Emergency Care Plan form and submit it before signing up for a bus.
